## The Hindustan Times Walk-out in Academic **Council over strike**

The continuing strike at the Delhi College of Engineering occasioned a long debate at the Academic Council meeting of Delhi University on Wednesday. At the end of it, 16 members of the Council walked out following differences with the Vice-Chancel-lor over the discussion regarding the minutes of the last Council meeting and the non-adoption of a resolution regarding Delhi col-lege of Engineering.

A spokesman of the University said that the Academic Council expressed its "deep concern" over the state of affairs at the Delhi College of Engineering to the Delhi Administration, and requested the Vice-Chancellor to make all possible efforts towards speedy implementation of the existing agreement between stu-dents and teachers in the college, which has been on strike since April 23.

Mr Sydney Rebeiro, who initi-ated the discussion on Delhi Col-lege of Engineering, alleged that the entire agreement was held up n the Union Finance Ministry due to red tape. He added that in the process a large number of stu-dents, especially those getting their degrees at the end of this academic year had already suffer-ed considerably with regard to lobs. lobs

The walk-out was reportedly due to the objections from some mem-pers to certain parts of the ninut's of the last Academic Jouncil meeting. The Vice-Chan-sellor adjourned the meeting for 0 minutes in the hope that the natter would be sorted out, but 0 no avail o no avail.

The members had been protest-ng about the subject of uniform-ty of eligibility conditions for ecruitment of lecturers in the Iniversity and colleges. They lleged that what had been sent of the Executive Council of the Iniversity after the last meeting, urporting to be the decision of ne Academic Council in this natter, was not correct, and anted to know why two decision ad been sent without getting

the minutes passed at the next meeting. The University spokesman de-

meeting. The University spokesman de-nied that the information given to the Executive Council had not reflected the decision of the Academic Council. He said that the Executive Council had been Informed quickly "in the interest of early advertisements for vac-ant positions which have been held up for the last 15 months". He claimed that the convention in the past had been to convey the decisions to the Executive Council after they had been read out at the same meeting of the Academic Council author-

had been taken. The Academic Council author-ized the Vice-Chancellor to flix the last dates for admissions to various undergraduate and post-graduate courses in the coming academic year. The Academic Council also re-iterated its earlier decision on the applicability of Ordinance 12 of the University rules to all professional colleges, the spokes-man said. May 1984

About 1,000 university teachers, on Thursday held a rally outside the office of the University Grant

the office of the University Grant Commission. Shouting slogans, the DUT, members demanded a written a surance on their demands from the UGC. A number of speakers including Mr S. K. Batra, acting president of the DUTA addressed the rally the rally.

the raily. Students belonging to the Com-mittee Against Goondaism show-ed support for the teachers' strike by turning up at the UGC lawns. These students felt that the teach-ors could not be expected to work

These students felt that the teachers could not be expected to work efficiently when they were worried about promotion and housing avenues and said that the UGC should concede the demands. Meanwhile, the University Social Brigade said in a Press release that the strike had resulted in a loss of 41 working days that amounted to 24% of the total academic year; about 40,000 students would not be able to appear for the UPSC and the bank service examinations. Mr Sydney ice examinations. Mr Sydney Rebeiro, convener of the Brigade, asked the Minister of State for Education, Mrs Sheila Kaul, and the UGC Chairman, Mrs Madhuri Shah to restore normalcy on the campus.

After the demonstration outside the UGC office, a DUTA deputation met the UGC's Vice-Chairman, Mr Rais Ahmed, who told them that he would convey their demands in the next UGC meeting. Regarding DUTA's main demand about promotional avenues, he said: "Let the Education Ministry take a decision" as talks were al-ready going on between the Min-istry and DUTA. Whatever the Ministry decides, the UGC would accept that, he told the teachers. Later in the evening, DUTA exp-cutive in a meeting decided to re-commend to the general body meeting on Friday (today) that the teachers' strike should con-tinue.

The executive also decided to The executive also decided to seek an authority from the gen-eral body to give it permission to call a general body meeting at a 24-hour notice whenever any con-crete offers were being made by the Ministry about their demands
